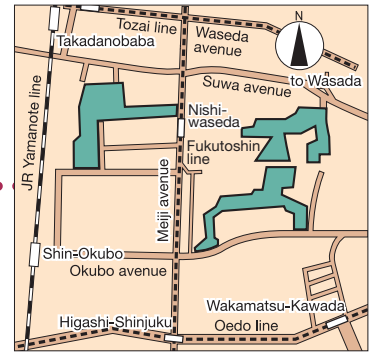


Mt. Hakone, the highest hill within the Yamanote Line

# Toyama Park



- Location** ● Toyama 2/ 3-chome, Okubo 3-chome, Shinjuku Ward

- Transport** ● 10-minute walk to Okubo section, 10-minute walk to Mt. Hakone section, from Shin-Okubo (JR Yamanote line) or Takadanobaba (JR line, Tozai line), 8-minute walk to Mt. Hakone section from Waseda (Tozai line).  
15-minute walk to Mt. Hakone section from Wakamatsu-Kawada (Oedo line).  
10-minute walk to Okubo section, 8-minute walk to Mt. Hakone section, from Nishi-waseda (Fukutoshin line).



The park is home to Mt. Hakone, the highest hill within the Yamanote Line. It is separated into the Mt. Hakone section centering on that hill, and Okubo section with fields on the other side of Meiji Street.

**Mt. Hakone** ● This area once held the Toyama Sanso Garden, built by Owari clan lord Mitsutomo Tokugawa in 1661-1673, that recreated sights from the 53 stages of the Tokaido Road. The garden was enormous, encompassing about 449,000 m<sup>2</sup> of rolling land. About 80% of it was taken up by ponds, making it a famous garden with pond-circling paths. A hill called Gyokuenho shaped like an overturned bowl covered the



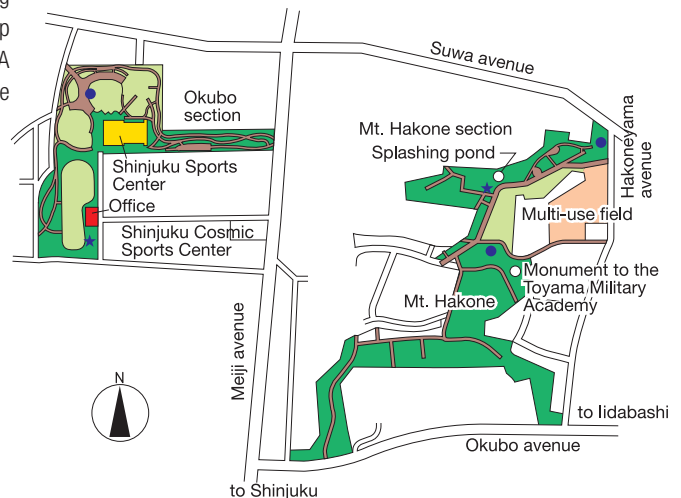

area is now called Mt. Hakone 44.6 meters above sea level. The rolling landscape is a place where children play, and the south side is a field that provides precious greenery for high-rise apartment dwellers.

**Monument to the Toyama Military Academy** ● Toyama Military Academy stood here from 1873 to 1945. A monument to commemorate that institution stands at the base of Mt. Hakone.
