

Tama Cemetery is the largest among the eight Metropolitan cemeteries, and it is also preserved in its natural state with redwoods and trees which represent the Musashino area. Visitors can enjoy beautiful cherry blossoms in spring and colorful leaves in autumn.

There are many famous historical figures buried in the cemetery and a number of people visit the place not only for the cemetery but for a walk and sightseeing.

It is the first cemetery park in our country to imitate the forest cemeteries of other countries (particularly Germany), and is an example for other cemetery parks. In order to reflect the changes in society, it also contains lawn cemeteries, wall cemeteries, mitama hall (large charnel house), and multi-charnel house cemeteries.
